

First-Year Course Recommendations - Sociology

Full-time students typically choose a combination of these courses - totaling 12-16 units per semester.

Major	SOC 101	Introduction to Sociology	This is a great introductory course which explores many of the topics typically covered in greater detail at four-year colleges. It also counts as a Social Science for general education. Note: it has a Skills Advisory of Eligibility for ENGL 110 .	3		
	SOC 109	Contemporary Social Problems	Some four year campuses want this course. See Assist.org to verify if you are required to take this courses for your specific transfer university. Note: It also has a Skills Advisory of Eligibility for ENGL 110 .	3		
General Education	English	See: Which English Courses Do I Need?	English is a foundational skill necessary for success in all college courses. Note: most SBCC courses have Skills Advisories of Eligibility for ENGL 110 . Take whichever level of English you assessed into.	3-5		
	Math	See: Understanding Your Math Course Placements	Math is a foundational skill that can be harder the longer you wait to take it. We recommend getting started on it now. You will need one college level math course for admission to the California public universities. Some Sociology majors (including UCSB) require Math 117 – Elementary Statistics for the major.	3-5		
	Arts and Humanities	See: IGETC Area 3A & 3B ; SBCC GE Area C	Look for courses with Skills Advisories which match your placement levels and that seem interesting to you. Some four year colleges (such as UCSB) want History courses for the Sociology major. These courses might count in this area.	3		
	Social Sciences	See: IGETC Area 4 ; SBCC GE Area B	Sociology courses count in this area, but if you plan to transfer you will also need at least one course from another area besides sociology. Some four year colleges want courses for the Sociology major from other disciplines in this area (i.e. Anthropology, History, Psychology). Check Assist.org and look for courses with Skills Advisories which match your placement levels and that seem interesting to you.	3		
	Science	See: IGETC Area 5A, 5B & 5C SBCC GE Pattern Area A	UC and CSU campuses require two science courses – one from each of two different areas, but only one of them is required to have a lab component. Underlined courses on IGETC are the ones with the labs.	3-4		
Electives	PD 100	College Success	PD 100 is designed to teach study skills for academic success in college. It introduces resources available at SBCC and allows students to explore major and transfer goals. PD 110 is designed to help students explore major and career options while also gaining interview, communication, and resume writing skills. Note: both courses transfer to UC's and CSU's but UC's only count units for one (so we recommend you only take one).	3

	PE	Physical Education Activities	You can transfer up to 4 units of PE activity courses to the UC system and more to CSU campuses. They can be a great way to manage stress and maintain physical health. Many of these courses are graded.	1
