

# Which English Courses Do I Need?

Your English Assessment Test was reviewed by SBCC's English Department to determine which English courses you need. Most students need a reading and a writing class, but your reading skills could be strong enough to test out of the reading sequence completely. It is also possible you might have assessed higher in one skill than the other.

Here is how to figure out which English courses you are going to need to get to where you want to go:

Step #1: Look up your English assessment course results for reading and writing on your Pipeline account.

Step #2: Find your course results on the Prerequisite Course Sequence table below.

Step #3: Find the target course(s) you need on the right of the sequence. Follow the arrows from your course results to your target course(s). Each course along the path is equal to one semester, but you can (and should if possible) take reading and writing courses in the same semester. It does not matter if your reading and writing courses are next to each other on the paths, but you will need to finish both paths before you will be able to take ENGL 110 which is a reading and writing course.

\*Note: Some CSU's and UC's require ENGL 111, but many allow students to take COMM 235 (Argumentation and Debate) or PHIL 111 (Critical Thinking and Writing in Philosophy) instead. Check Assist.org to determine if your dream campus requires ENGL 111 specifically.
